TPAA Gender Survey

The following results were gathered from a survey of TPAA members, which accepted responses between 17/6/2025-24/6/2025.

Q1: Have you taught a class whereby one or more students identified as a gender which is different to their sex? (i.e. a biological male who identifies as a female)

Yes: 69.2%

No: 30.8%

Q2: Does your employer have clear guidelines on how to approach the subjects of gender identity and transgenderism?

Yes: 45.2%

No: 54.8%

Q3: Do you feel pressure to comply with employer guidelines regarding gender identity which go against your personal beliefs on the matter?

Yes: 69.5%

No: 30.5%

Q4: Does your employer encourage, allow or ban the display of transgender pride flags/stickers/print outs in classrooms or around the school?

Allow: 57%

Encourage: 25.4%

Ban: 17.6%

Q5: Do you believe that transgender ideology should be taught in schools?

Yes: 8.6%

No: 91.4%

Q6: Do you believe that someone can legitimately become a member of the opposite sex? (i.e. a biological male, through drugs and surgery, becomes a female)

Yes: 16.1%

No: 83.9%

Q7: Do you believe that children should be able to take puberty blocking drugs, which the Cass Review and other landmark contemporary studies have indicated are irreversible?

Yes: 6.1%

No: 93.9%

Q8: Do you believe that children should be allowed to have transgender surgery? (i.e. breast or penis removal)

Yes: 3.2%

No: 96.8%

Q9: Do you believe that it is a good or bad thing that students are more frequently identifying as transgender?

Good: 2.5%

Bad: 83.9%

Neither good nor bad: 13.6%

Q10: What do you believe is the primary cause for the increase in students identifying as transgender?

Social contagion 45.9%

Transgender ideology being pushed in schools: 23.7%

Greater acceptance and freedom to express identity: 10.4%

Combination of those and other factors (no or other primary reason): 20%

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
